WORLD ELDERS ABUSE AWARENESS DAY -2021

Both the Younger generations & Society at large needs to be sensitized to enable Elders to live peacefully with dignity and respect in their fag end of life. Print / electronics media should play a vital role by highlighting this unique problem in their esteemed newspapers /TV channels. Confederation could not hold a candle march on 15-06-2021 in association with Help Age India at Jantar Mantar, like past years to draw the attention of Delhi Govt./Govt. of India & Delhi Police in this regard due to Lock down restrictions.

HIGH COURT PRODS TO CENTRAL GOVT. TO INVOLVE RWAs FOR VACCINATION IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COLONIES

The Delhi High Court has asked the Centre to "seriously consider" involving the Residents Welfare Associations (RWAs) in the Capital for organizing vaccination drives within their respective colonies for the residents. A Bench of Justice Vipin Sanghi and Justice Jasmeet Singh said "permitting vaccinations to be undertaken at such camps would go a long way in making it convenient and safe for the residents of the colonies to get themselves vaccinated at such centres". "The Centre should, therefore, seriously consider this proposal at the earliest," the court said. "In our view, the said aspect deserves serious consideration, and unless there are any specific reasons why the Central government would not want the RWAs to play a role in the vaccination drive, there should be no impediment in designating the camps organized by the RWAs in association with private hospitals as vaccination centres run by private hospitals," it said. "However, in case, the Centre, for any good reason, is not inclined to permit RWAs to organize such camps in association with private hospitals, the reasons shall be disclosed in the next status report," the court said. The court has posted the case for further hearing on July 7, when the court reopens after vacations. - EDITOR

EPF BENEFICIARIES WILL GET COMPENSATION OF RS. 7 LAKH IN CASE DIED DUE TO COVID-19

Kartikey S Singh, Regional PF Commissioner -I (Pension), Employee's Provident Fund Organization, Ministry of Labour & Employment, Govt. of India has notified guidelines on 29-04-2021, which are reproduced below :- (i) The maximum assurance benefit payable under paragraph 22 (3) of Employees' Deposit-Linked Insurance Scheme, 1976. Scheme has been enhanced to Rs. 7 lakh from earlier maximum benefit of Rs. 6 lakh (Under para 22 (3) of the scheme, the salary multiple shall be 35). (ii) The minimum assurance benefit payable under paragraph 22(3) of the EDLI Scheme has been fixed as Rs.2.50 lakh w.e.f. 15.02.2020 (i.e. with effect from the date of lapse of said benefit). (iii) The benefit payable under paragraph 22(3) of EDLI Scheme shall be extended to such beneficiaries where the deceased employee was a member of the Fund or a provident fund exempted under Section 17 of the EPF & MP Act aid was ii employment for a continuous period of 12 months preceding the month ii which he died, irrespective of change of establishment during the said period. (iv) Under paragraph 28(4) of EDLI Scheme, the power to grant exemption to a class of employees from the provisions of the scheme has been delegated to ACC (Zone). (v) The monetary fee payable under paragraph 29 of EDLI Scheme has been enhanced to Rs.25,000. The provisions as mentioned ii sub-paragraph (i), (ii) & (iii) above shall remain ii force for a period of three years from their date of publication ii the Official Gazette. It is requested to bring above scheme amendments to the notice of all employers as well as employees covered under your jurisdiction through appropriate modes of publicity. It also intimated that all such proposals for grant of exemption from EDLI Scheme, 1976 that may have been forwarded to this office are required to be re-examined by concerned offices in light of above amendment for further n. a. In the pending exemption proposals where the establishment may have sought exemption for a "class of employees", where such class may be regular employees of the establishment or any other such defied class, appropriate action for grant of exemption may be taken in accordance with relevant directions issued from time to time. - EDITOR

INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY -2021

DELHI UNLOCK -3.0 GUIDELINES DATED 13-06-2021

The national capital will unlock further from 14-06-2021 with restaurants allowed to open with 50 per cent seating capacity, while markets and shopping malls will not be regulated by the odd-even formula anymore, letting them operate at full capacity. Making the announcement on 13-06-2021, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said the government was aiming to bring the city's economy on track while making robust arrangements to tackle a possible third wave of Covid-19. All markets, market complexes, and shopping malls can open without any odd-even restrictions from Monday . However , business activities will be allowed between 10 am and 8 pm, after which shops will have to down shutters . Restaurants have been allowed to open with 50 per cent seating capacity. “We will observe how the situation unfolds over the course of the week,” Kejriwal said . One weekly market will be allowed per zone every day, the CM said. These markets usually witness heavy footfall and ensuring social distancing among customers and shopkeepers emerged as a major challenge during the previous rounds of unlocking. The Delhi Metro will continue to operate with 50 per cent seating capacity, as will public buses. In case of autos, cabs, maximum two passengers per vehicle will be permitted. Marriages and funerals can take place with the permitted number of guests capped at 20. However, public places such as banquet halls, auditoriums will remain shut. Spas, gymnasiums, swimming pools, public parks and gardens will remain shut. Cinema halls, multiplexes and entertainment parks have also not been allowed to open. Schools, colleges will continue to remain shut as well, the CM said. - **EDITOR**

Contd..Page...3 with Confederation members respectively . He told that Maintenance Act, 2007 was enacted by the Ministry which was adopted in Delhi in the year of 2009 by making 2 vital amendments dated 19-12-2016 & 28-07-2017 for the protection of victim senior citizens suffering from various kind of abuses /humiliations at the hands of their own sons & daughters for expediting eviction proceedings / Maintenance Claims against them who are not looking after their parents through 11 District Tribunal Courts across Delhi / Appellate Court of Divisional Commissioner . Senior Citizens Council of Delhi in association with Confederation has solved many such cases amicably at their own level through helpline no: 9810488059 operational daily between 2 pm and 8 pm and in some cases through Tribunal Courts / Appellate Court . He gave various suggestions i.e. **a)** A meeting should be convened at the level of Chief Secretary to examine cases which are pending for more than 2 years in Tribunal Courts/ Appellate Court, although , each court is required to furnish status of court cases to Social Welfare Department on 7th of each month . **b)** Efforts should be made to get the Maintenance & Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens (Amendment) Bill, 2019 from the Parliament , which is now pending with the Ministry to consider suggestions / directions issued by Standing Committee of Lok Sabha . Incidentally , it may be pointed out that the Amended bill was presented in Lok Sabha on 11 -12 -2019 after recommendations of National Productivity Council New Delhi whose representatives also discussed personally with J.R. Gupta at Recreation Center , Green Park Extension and included his vital suggestions i.e particularly Tribunal Court Cases should be disposed of within 30 days including Maintenance Allowance cap of Rs.10,000 /- should be abolished . **c)** Experienced staff should be deputed on Helpline by Help Age India. **d)** Implementation of directions of High Court of Delhi and Supreme Court of India on 21-05-2018 & 13-12-2018 respectively , although , Confederation brought this to the notice of Chief Minister of Delhi & Social Welfare Minister on 18-11-2019 & 10-10-2020. **e)** Supreme Court judgement dated 15-12-2020 needs to be reviewed by the Law Department of Ministry as in this case relief has been allowed to daughter - in-law on the grounds that Domestic Violence Act, 2005 was enacted before Maintenance Act, 2007. **f)** Efforts should be made by the Delhi Govt . to enhance at least 2% interest on FDRs of senior citizens which was also approved by the Social Welfare Minister , Dy . CM in the aforesaid meetings with Confederation members . **g)** Half yearly recreation grants to SCAs should be released in time in future, as the same is pending even for the period of 2019 -20 to some SCAs . Other speakers were R.K.Das , Member , Maintenance Tribunal , North -East District , Dr . Brijesh Pachisia , Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta , Member , M.T. Shadara , Rachna Gupta & many more. The programme was concluded followed by vote of thanks by the Staff of Social Welfare Department.
