The Council also distributing blankets to poorly elderly on Makar Sankranti every year and also distributing free stationary & exercise book to poor students of MCD school every year. The President of the Council is also National Executive Chair Person of the Indian Society of Universities of 3rd Age (ISU3A). The

Life membership fee of Council is Rs. 1700/- with effect from 01-04-2024 & onward, as Elderly News would be circulated free of cost.

The Council is also helping Senior Citizens below poverty line to get them old age pension from Delhi Govt. The council is also printing telephone directory every year indicating name, address & telephone numbers of the members of the council to enable them to interact with each other round the clock since 01-01-2014. The Council is also building pressure on Govt. of Delhi to dispose of cases of Senior Citizens in any Govt. Departments by making on files "Senior Citizens" in a time bound period not more than 3 months. DEALING WITH A SUICIDE CRISIS

institutional remedies and interventions at various levels are necessary to address mental health issues

At 12.3 per 100,000, India's suicide rate in 2023 was the second-highest since 1996, when the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) started giving such data. The highest suicide rate, of 12.4, was recorded in 2022. That the spike in suicides post the Covid-19 period was yet to abate in 2023 reflects persisting agony, perhaps from the exacerbation of factors contributing to suicide.

The insidious nature of economic vulnerability and suffering comes through upon reading some datapoints from the just-released NCRB 2023 report. Family problems and illnesses were the two leading causes behind suicide in India, and that too by a wide margin. Suicides due to indebtedness were just a small fraction compared to suicides due to illnesses, and even smaller in comparison to family problems. Daily wage earners and housewives constituted the two largest occupational groups among suicide cases, even as two-thirds of deaths were of people who had never attended college. In a low-middle income nation like India, it is hard not to see correlations with dimmer prospects and financial troubles seeping into familial dynamics and treatment costs, fostering distress and despair.

As several factors, from conflict between nations to the march of technology, leave their imprint on economies and new sources of distress emerge — mass loss of lives, job loss, forced migration as also its effects on immigrant-receiving societies, resource competition, polarisation — vulnerability will only worsen. Given no geography can hope to remain untouched, the trends in suicides should be a warning for a country like India to invest in reducing vulnerability and improving mental health for millions.

Keeping a suicide crisis under check will need the nation to think beyond suicide helplines. These helplines are certainly important, but accessed as they are at a much later stage in the progression of suicidal behaviour, a comprehensive prevention outlook is needed. Interventions are necessary at all levels and in all forms, across age groups. From regular mental health monitoring in schools/colleges to affordable, de-stigmatised counselling for individuals and families, from targeted mental health support services for occupational groups to awareness campaigns, solutions will have to come together as a weave of societal and governance interventions. All of this will need serious capacity. To start with, India must increase its psychiatrist strength: currently, it is estimated to have less than one psychiatrist per 100,000 population against the WHO recommendation of three. And, of course, the larger policy ecosystem will have a role to play when it comes to reducing the economic vulnerability of people and building more secure populations.

Made in India AI, for India and the world

If India doesn't develop aatmanirbharta in AI, our future may involve having AI services powered by our own data, but owned by others, and then sold back to us.

As Artificial Intelligence (AI) continues to transform and revolutionise the way we live and work, it's essential to recognise its vast potential and harness its power to drive positive and constructive societal change. It is imperative for India to develop sovereign capabilities in this field for three primary reasons.

First, aatmanirbharta (self-reliance) will spur our domestic start-up ecosystem and attract private sector investment. Other AI leaders are already seeing the benefits of this independence. For instance, China recently banned Nvidia chips to boost sovereign chip-making capacity.

7K SEATS VACANT: MOP-UP ROUND FOR ADMISSION IN DU FROM TODAY

NEW DELHI: Delhi University's (DU) physical on-the-spot mop-up admission for under-graduate courses is scheduled to begin on Tuesday. Officials on Monday said that about 7,000 seats remain vacant across several categories and 2,000 seats remain vacant in PwD (Persons with Disabilities), despite multiple admission cycles.

"Most of the vacant seats are in the peripheral colleges but some are also in language courses in colleges like Hansraj," said Haneet Gandhi, dean of admission, DU.

DU had announced the physical mode admission last week, which unlike the regular admission process, will be conducted on the basis of class 12 marks and not Common University Entrance Test (CUET) scores.

Registrations for this round began from 5 pm on September 17 and continued till 11.59 pm on September 19.

COURT RULES OUT FOUL PLAY IN COP DROWNING AT TRAINING CENTRE

NEW DELHI: Thirteen years after Delhi Police constable Manish Kumar died after drowning inside a water tank at a police training centre in Malviya Nagar, a Delhi court has closed the case, ruling out foul play.

In an order dated September 16 and uploaded on Monday, Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Jyoti Maheshwari said while the death of a young police trainee was unfortunate, there was no evidence to suggest homicide.

"After considering all the material on record, this court is of the considered opinion that no prima facie case is made out," the court said.

The court dismissed a petition by the constable's father, ASI Krishan Kumar, who challenged the CBI's closure report and claimed there was foul play.

Snakes in the backyard

Cross-border terrorism remains a live threat; an exception can't be made for Pakistan

India has used the global response to terrorism to highlight the dysfunctional state of the UN, with external affairs minister S Jaishankar telling the UN General Assembly (UNGA) that the world body has been unable to forge common ground on challenges such as terror and conflicts. Jaishankar used India's statement at the UNGA to once again highlight the need to counter terrorism emanating from Pakistan, to which international terror attacks have been traced back and whose nationals often find mention in lists of sanctioned terrorists. While reiterating Pakistan's links to the Pahalgaon terror attack, India again called for deeper global cooperation to oppose the use of terror as State policy, the mushrooming of terror hubs and the financing of terrorism. Given the newfound bonhomie between the US and Pakistan, Jaishankar's remark that those who condone nations sponsoring terror "will find that it comes back to bite them", is a reminder of the fallout of the activities of Pakistan-based terror outfits.

TN stampede lessons for political parties

The death of 40 persons in a stampede at a political rally of the Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK), the political party founded by actor Vijay, in Karur, Tamil Nadu, is tragic. Claims that the chaos was caused, in part, by the actor arriving hours late, and that he continued to speak even as people were being crushed to death, need investigation. In some ways, it recalls the stampede at a religious function in Hathras, UP, in which 121 persons died. In Hathras, close to 250,000 crowded into a space that was sanctioned for some 80,000 persons with insufficient exits and crowd management measures. A judicial commission found "serious lapses" on the part of organisers of the event and the state administration. In Karur, the TVK expected a crowd of 10,000, while the police estimates that 30,000 gathered. The lapses on the part of the organisers and the administration are self-evident: from a venue ill-suited for a rally to the absence of crowd management.
